Letter from the Founder

With the cost of living sky-rocketing, and a climate crisis hanging over our heads, **we need to think of solutions that benefit local communities** as well as the wider world we're living in.

We know modern fashion production is having a catastrophic impact on the environment and the people who are paid slave wages to produce it. On a local level, we see clothes dumped in laneways around the area. On a global level, we see images of deserts full of dumped dead-stock and poorly constructed factories crashing to the ground.

Mass produced fashion ends up being the most affordable, but fast fashion and the people who buy it have often been vilified. We can't expect to change hearts and minds to

second-hand overnight, especially by telling people that they're doing something wrong. In the midst of this Cost of Living Crisis, it's essential that we encourage the true value of sharing, saving much needed money, and building community.

The idea of Change Clothes Crumlin is to create a welcoming clothing reuse hub that also serves as a social and learning space. In 2023, our goal is to build on the swapping and upcycling services we've been offering locally, with a long-term goal of opening up a permanent clothing reuse hub in the area.

We hope that we can open people's minds to second hand, mending, and creative reuse in a 'gradual steps' type of way. Join us in our local revolution!

Oileán brings insight into youth engagement, as a previous ECO-UNESCO volunteer and programme participant, and current member of Plan International's Youth Advisory Panel.


Most notably, Oileán was appointed as the Climate Youth Delegate for DECC and NYCI at COP27 this year.





2022 in Numbers

We only really got **started in Q4**, but achieved the following:







According to the UK Carbon Trust, the average **carbon footprint of a t shirt over the span of its lifetime is 15kg.**

If we say that all 1,292 items had an average carbon footprint of a t-shirt (which they didn't, a huge number of larger items such as jeans, jumpers and coats were swapped), **we have saved 19.38 carbon tonnes in just 3 months with Change Clothes Crumlin.**

19.38 carbon tonnes saved in just 3 months...




